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Pronunciation of Tube Stations
English pronunciation is not simple because of:
-Extra vowel sounds: London [ˈlʌndən], Borough [ˈbɒrə], and Southwark [ˈsʌðə(r)k] share the same stressed vowel, the strut vowel [ʌ], and the same unstressed vowel: the schwa [ə].
-Complex Spelling rules: Blackwall [ˈblakwɔːl], Star Lane [ˈstɑː(r)ˈleɪn].
-Multiple Exceptions: Sometimes, even native speakers are not sure of the pronunciation as there are words that don't resemble anything else, such as South Quay [ˌsaʊθˈkwiː].
-Disappearing consonants: Some consonants are always silent, like the <c> in Leicester Square [ˌleɪstə(r)ˈskwɜː(r)ɪ].
-Conclusion: There is no agreement on the standard pronunciation of Marylebone, with many considered correct.
